TOPIC

PURPOSE

DETAILS

1. Age group: 5-18 years. Winners will be chosen along 3 categories:
 - 5-9years
 - 10-12 years
 - 13-18 years
2. Time of submission: Before 4pm every day
3. Announcement of winners: 8pm the next day after submission
4. Medium: Your choice
5. Size: Your choice
6. Certificates: Digital certificates will be sent across to the registered email ID. At the end of the competition series, the Participation Certificates will be issued digitally as well.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

1. Label your artwork: Student name, class, school name must be written
2. Art must be ORIGINAL and AUTHENTIC. Do NOT copy from the internet or elsewhere
3. Photo quality: Make sure the image of your art is clear. The art, details should not be blurred.
4. Title: Give a title / heading to your artwork too!

PROCESS
